


RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe has requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct a graveled road from Highway 73 to North East Diamond Creek Subdivision and

WHEREAS, the Tribe wishes to grant a gratuitous Right-of-Way from the beginning of the project at Highway 73, 50 feet in width and 975 feet in length.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it grants to the Bureau of Indian Affairs a gratuitous Right-Of-Way as recorded on a map on file in the Office of the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Indian Agency, Whiteriver, Arizona to which reference is hereby made.

The foregoing resolution was on July 10, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (45 Stat. 984).
