

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised by Council Member Darvin Burnette that he has received numerous complaints from tribal members residing near or who have farmland in the area of the Springline construction that numerous ditches, excavations and access roads built by Development Enterprise during the Springline construction project have not been restored to the site conditions existing prior to the construction; and
- WHEREAS, the access roads built during the construction period are presently experiencing heavy traffic with resultant damage to farmlands; and further, that some of the Springline itself appears to be unprotected and exposed; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Tribal Engineering Department should review and assess what is necessary to restore the land to its original condition and to report back to the Tribal Council work that must be done in order to protect the Springline and restore the construction site to its original condition.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Tribal Engineer Gene Riggs to contact Council Member Darvin Burnette and conduct an immediate review of the site conditions in the Springline area and report back to the Tribal Council through the Office of the Tribal Chairman what action is necessary to restore the land to a condition existing prior to the Springline construction as well as the cost of any additional work to insure that the Springline itself is protected from damage.

The foregoing resolution was on July 14, 1986 duly adopted by a vote of 9 for and 1 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
