RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

COMPLETED  
11 SEP 1986

WHEREAS, Mr. Max Goklish a member of the Carrizo Livestock Association advises the Tribal Council that he represents ten cattle owners from Forestdale who have approximately one-hundred (100) cattle in the Carrizo Livestock Association; and


WHEREAS, Mr. Goklish further advises the Tribal Council that due to a significant loss of cattle owned by the Forestdale Cattle owners, he and the other Forestdale Cattle owners wish to withdraw from the Carrizo Livestock Association and form a new association to be known as the Forestdale Livestock Association; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with said request.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby authorizes the Forestdale Cattle Owners to withdraw from the Carrizo Livestock Association for the purpose of forming a new cattle livestock association.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Forestdale Livestock Association must comply with existing Livestock Association Grazing Ordinances presently in effect as well as all applicable tribal and federal regulations pertaining to land use and brands for livestock associations.

The foregoing resolution was on August 6, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
