

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Washington Office Bureau of Indian Affairs has directed the Fort Apache Agency to identify and donate to the White Mountain Apache Tribe excess facilities not vital to the Bureau's operation; and

WHEREAS, the Fort Apache Agency has determined that the Maverick Fire Camp is only vital during high to very high fire danger; and

WHEREAS, this need occurs for only one to two months, specifically during June and July each year; and


WHEREAS, the Maverick Fire Camp is an important facility of the White Mountain Apache Tribe Game and Fish Department more than six months per year.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, that it thereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs turn over the Maverick Fire Camp to the White Mountain Apache Tribal Game and Fish Department.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Bureau of Indian Affairs should have exclusive use of the Maverick Fire Camp during periods of high to Very high fire danger during June and July of each year and negotiate use during other periods when the Branch of Forestry shows need therefore.

The foregoing resolution was on August 8, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 7 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and By-Laws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
