

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, pursuant to Resolution No. 86-355, established a Tribal Safety Committee whose purpose is to establish a reservation wide safety program; and

WHEREAS, the specific goals of the safety program should be established by Tribal Safety Officers Darvin Burnette, Ray J. Ivans, Lucille Country, Tribal Planner, and the Superintendent of the Bureau of Indian Affairs; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Burnette, Mr. Ray Ivans and Mr. Bradley should meet and confer with Tribal Search and Rescue Agencies and Departments, the Whiteriver Police Department, the BIA Law Enforcement and the Emergency Medical Technicians Services, Game and Fish Department and prepare safety recommendations for implementation by the Tribal Council.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that Mr. Darvin Burnette and Ray J. Ivans, Tribal Safety Officers, meet with BIA Superintendent, Mr. Russell Bradley, and Tribal Planner, Ms. Lucille Country, for the purpose of establishing an overall Tribal Safety Program for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of ten for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i), (s) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
