RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that employees of Logging Contracts on the reservation are cutting firewood during working hours and that said wood is being sold to and hauled from the reservation by non-members; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to stop this practice in order to impose proper controls on the cutting of firewood by any logging employee and transporting of firewood by non-members off the reservation.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby prohibits any employee, whether non-members or members of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, from cutting any firewood during his or her hours of employment with any logging operation within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it hereby directs the Office of the Tribal Chairman to notify by letter each logging contractor or subcontractor operating on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation that their employees are explicitly prohibited from cutting any firewood for sale, resale, offer for resale, or for transportation off the reservation, and that all logging contractors and subcontractors are directed to vigorously enforce this Tribal Council prohibition.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 11 for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h), (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
