RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised of the necessity of a pedestrian foot bridge to provide a means by which tribal members residing in what is known as the Seven-Mile Jr. Village, to cross the North Fork of the White River; and

WHEREAS, the Bureau of Indian Affairs is responsible for the construction of said bridge; and

WHEREAS, without the bridge, tribal members residing in the Seven-Mile Jr. Village are presently forced to travel great distance out of their way on foot.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs to construct a pedestrian foot bridge as soon as possible so that tribal members residing in the Seven-Mile Jr. area will have a means by which they can safely cross the North Fork of the White River.

The foregoing resolution was on November 6, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of eleven for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i), (h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
