RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is concerned over the disease of alcoholism and recognizes alcohol as part of the larger problem of drug abuse; and
- WHEREAS, H.R. 5484, the Indian Alcohol and Drug bill was enacted into law on October 27, 1986; and
- WHEREAS, H.R. 5485 appropriates funding for alcohol/drug treatment, prevention and rehabilitation programs to Indian Tribes; and
- WHEREAS, it is recommended that a Tribal Coordinating Committee be established and comprised of the following persons or their representatives: Superintendent of the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the Fort Apache Agency, Service Unit Director of the Whiteriver Service Unit, Chief of Police for the Whiteriver Police department, Adult and Juvenile Judges from the Whiteriver Tribal courts, Director of the Tribal Alcoholism Program, Superintendent of the Schools and any other person or persons designated as appropriate by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council requests that the Tribal Coordinating Committee commence its study as soon as possible and report back to the Tribal Council in approximately thirty (30) days.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby establishes a Tribal coordinating Committee to study the impact of H.R. 5484 on existing programs and the development of new programs on the fort Apache Indian Reservation; said Committee to be comprised of the following persons or their representatives: Superintendent of the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the Fort Apache Agency, Service Unit Director of the Whiteriver Service Unit, Chief of Police for the Whtieriver Police Department, Adult and Juvenile Judges from the Whiteriver Tribal Court, Director of the Tribal Alcoholism Program, Superintendent of Schools and any other person or persons designated as appropriate by the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that the Committee report its findings to the office of the Tribal Chairman and Tribal Council approximately thirty (30) days from receipt of this Resolution.


