

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Mr. Earl Green, the Tribal Agricultural Enterprise Manager, has requested Tribal Council assistance in enforcement and possible amendment to Tribal Ordinance No. 99, which regulates trespassing livestock within the exterior boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Green advises the Tribal Council that the Canyon Day Farm is experiencing damage due to trespassing livestock, primarily privately owned horses within the Canyon Day Community, which have trespassed through breaks in the fence into the alfalfa fields; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after some discussion, concludes that a committee comprised of the Tribal Attorney, Tribal Safety Director's Office, the Chief of the Whiteriver Police Department, Director of Game & Fish Department, and Mr. Green, should meet and propose recommendations to the Tribal Council to either enforce or amend Ordinance No. 99; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Attorney's Office and the Tribal Assistant Safety Director, Darvin Burnette, are directed to coordinate said committee meeting.


BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs Mr. Darvin Burnette, the Assistant Tribal Safety Director, to arrange a meeting between the Tribal Attorney's Office, Chief of Police, Game & Fish Department, and Mr. Earl Green, Agricultural Enterprise Manager, for the purpose of preparing recommendations to the Tribal Council in respect to the enforcement and possible amendment of Ordinance No. 99 to resolve the ongoing livestock trespass problem on the reservation.


