FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council recognizes the importance of fish and wildlife resources on Indian lands; and

WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council encourages a Native American Fish and Wildlife Society as a national organization devoted to assisting Indian tribes in developing and protecting fish and wildlife resources located on Indian Reservations; and


WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council recognizes that the ineffective position of the Society is due in large part to the lack of a permanent office and staff, and further recognizes the immediate need thereof, in order to achieve its purposes and better serve the needs of the Indian community in matters relating to Fish and Wildlife resources.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby supports the Native American Fish and Wildlife Society in its efforts to establish a permanent office and staff, and further supports any proposal for funding from the Bureau of Indian Affairs which may be available.

The foregoing resolution was on December 4, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT FOR AND ZERO AGAINST by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a, f, i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
