RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, it is reported to the Tribal Council that Mrs. Neva Aday has been violating the land assignment right of Mr. John Cosen by planting on land which was assigned to him by the Tribal Land Board; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is further advised that the Tribal Court has admonished Mrs. Aday to cease interfering with John Cosen's right in his land assignment; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the decisions of the Land Board and admonishment of the Tribal Court to Mrs. Aday to cease interfering with the land rights of John Cosen should be heeded by Mrs. Aday and that she should respect the decision of the land board and the directive of the Tribal Court for her to cease interfering with Mr. John Cosen's rights in his land assignment.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby recognizes the jurisdiction of the land board concerning the subject land assignment, and the directive of the tribal court ordering Mrs. Aday to cease her interference with the rights of Mr. John Cosen in his land assignment.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of 8 for and 0 against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a, i, h, m, t, u), of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and

approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958,  
pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.
