


RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Tribal Council Member Herbert Tate advises the Tribal Council that electrical base board heating installed in the brick HUD homes is unduly expensive and has caused financial problems for tribal members residing in these homes; and

WHEREAS, after some discussion of the financial burden caused by these expensive heating units, the Tribal Council concludes that a request should be made to the Director of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority that he look into the matter and make recommendations to the Council for the replacement of these expensive units.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Director of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority to inquire into the financial burden caused by the expensive electrical heating units that were installed in the brick HUD homes and that he make recommendations to the Tribal Council on how to alleviate the expensive operating cost of said units.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
