

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council in previous resolutions requested that the Bureau of Indian Affairs construct pedestrian foot and vehicle bridges where needed throughout the various communities on the reservation, but that to date the bridges have not yet been constructed; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council wishes to reaffirm its previous bridge resolutions to emphasize the great community need for these pedestrian and vehicle bridges; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council further concludes that the BIA should be notified that the Tribal Council regards the construction of pedestrian and vehicle bridges as a top priority.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the Bureau of Indian Affairs local Agency give the construction of vehicle and pedestrian foot bridges in various tribal communities top priority and that construction thereof be expedited as quickly as possible for the benefit of the people.

The foregoing resolution was on December 5, 1986, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
