RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Tribal Resolution No. 86-325 the Tribal Council unanimously voted to request the Bureau of Indian Affairs of the Fort Apache Agency to develop a gravel road system for Arizona HUD Projects AZ 16-30 and 16-31; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has requested that tribal members Dora Dayaye, Dollie Guy, Verlie Caddo, Marie Griggs, Ashley Griggs, and Jeremiah Lee be included in the gravel road plan of the Bureau of Indian Affairs described in Resolution 86-325; and
- WHEREAS, the above mentioned tribal members currently have dirt roads leading to their homes which are inaccessible by vehicles during inclement weather; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees that the tribal members listed herein should be included on the Bureau of Indian Affairs Gravel Road Plan and Bureau Roads Priority List.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the gravel road plan devised by the Bureau of Indian Affairs for Arizona HUD Projects AZ 16-30 and 16-31 should also include the names of Ms. Dora Dayaye, Ms. Dollie Guy, Ms. Verlie Caddo, Ms. Marie Griggs, Mr. Ashley Griggs, and Mr. Jeremiah Lee as part of the Bureau's Road Priority List.

The foregoing resolution was on January 15, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of <u>TEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
