

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, Tribal Members Thomas Tessler and Press Burnette, both of whom reside in Canyon Day on separate homesites, advise the Tribal Council that although they are already residing on the homesites in Canyon Day, they lack documentation evidencing their ownership of said homesites; and


WHEREAS, Mr. Tessler and Press Burnette request Tribal Council approval for the homesites that they are already residing on; and


WHEREAS, the Tribal Council, after discussion determines that there is no conflict for these homesites and therefore, sees no legal obstacle to approving their requests.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves the homesites for tribal members Thomas Tessler and Press Burnette, presently residing in Canyon Day.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it directs Mr. Tessler and Press Burnette to notify the newly constituted Tribal Land Board of this formal assignment so that appropriate records can be made with the Tribal Land Board Office.

The foregoing resolution was on February 4, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i,h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
