

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is a federally recognized tribe organized under and pursuant to Section 16 of the Indian Reorganization Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984); and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is mandated within its constitution and bylaws to promote the social and economic development of its constituents; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the Office of Indian Programs, Housing and Urban Development has Community Development Block grants available in the (approximate) amount of \$500,000.00; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concludes that the Tribal Planning Office should be authorized to aggressively pursue and complete the FY 86/87 Community Development Block Grant; and
- WHEREAS, the CDBG proposal will be developed in accordance with Resolution No. 85-153 the Tribal Overall Economic Development Plan,

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby:

1. Authorizes the Tribal Planning Office to aggressively pursue and complete the FY 86/87 Department of Housing and Urban Development - Community Development Block Grant in accordance with the Overall Economic Development Plan and Committee; and
2. Authorizes the Tribal Chairman, Mr. Reno Johnson, Sr., to request funds, approve and sign all necessary documents in accordance with Federal regulations authorizing the grant proposal.

The foregoing resolution was on February 5, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ONE against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i)(j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
