RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority is proceeding with plans to secure funding for Projects AZ 16-40 and AZ 16-42 for construction of homes in a subdivision to be located northeast of the Rainbow City Subdivision; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has been advised that there is a need for the Tribe to grant an access right-of-way whereon may be constructed a road which will give access from existing right-of-ways to the subdivision plots; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that the Bureau of Indian Affairs will provide the survey for the right-of-way and will construct the grade and the drain, and will maintain the access road after its construction; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the requested right-of-way access should be granted in order to facilitate construction of Projects AZ 16-40 and AZ 16-42.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants a right-of-way for the construction of an access road to service the AZ 16-40 and AZ 16-42 HUD housing projects northeast of Rainbow City. The right-of-way shall be surveyed, constructed, and maintained by the Bureau of Indian Affairs. The right-of-way shall substantially conform to the attached diagram showing its location.

The foregoing resolution was on May 27, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a)(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
