## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has been reported to the Tribal Council and the Tribal Council is aware that all logs currently supplied to the Cibecue Sawmill are currently being supplied by independent contract loggers who employ tribal members; and
- whereas, the tribal members employed by the contractors have reported to the Tribal Council that they have experienced problems with the contractors, such as frequent lay-offs and other employment related problems, and these tribal member loggers have requested that logging operations carried out by FATCO be re-established to service the Cibecue Sawmill; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that the feasibility of reactivating FATCO logging operations for the Cibecue sawmill should be investigated.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby appoints the following individuals to serve on a committee to investigate the feasibility of reactivating FATCO logging operations to service the Cibecue sawmill: Councilmember Ray Ivans, Councilmember Marjorie Grimes, Councilmember Kino Kane, Councilmember Darvin Burnette, Vice-Chairman Alvino Hawkins, Russell Bradley, Superintendent of the BIA, and Scott Canty, Assistant Tribal Attorney.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that each and every Council Member is encouraged to conduct their own investigation on the feasibility of re-establishing FATCO logging to service the Cibecue Sawmill, and to come prepared at the next Council Meeting with comments and a written report, if so desired, to be submitted at that time for Council consideration.

The foregoing resolution was on August 7, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(a),(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
