RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes that Alcohol Abuse is one of the most devastating problems of the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council recognizes the traumatic and detrimental effects of Alcohol Abuse on all tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Kino Kane, Director of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Detox Center, recommends that the week of August 9-15, 1987, be declared "Alcohol Awareness Week" with August 13, 1987, as a "No Drinking Day", in which no alcoholic beverages will be sold on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council agrees with Mr. Kane that an "Alcohol Awareness Week" and a "No Drinking Day" should be observed in special recognition of the problems arising from alcoholism and that August 9-15, 1987, be declared as "Alcohol Awareness Week" and August 13, 1987, be designated as "No Drinking Day" with all sales of alcoholic beverages prohibited on the reservation.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby declares August 9-15, 1987, as "Alcohol Awareness Week" and designates August 13, 1987, as "No Drinking Day" and directs that on August 13, 1987, no alcohol beverages will be sold within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain that a copy of the resolution should be delivered to Apache Enterprise and to the Tribal Liquor Agent, and otherwise posted as necessary.

The foregoing resolution was on AUGUST 7, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of TEN FOR AND ZERO AGAINST by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.-984).
