RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN AFACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- tribal member Jackson Gatewood has informed the Tribal WHEREAS, Council that his HIP Home has been only partially completed due to the recent shut down of the White Mountain Apache Skill Center; and
- the HIP Home Coordinator advises the Council that WHEREAS, funds are available to complete construction of Mr. Gatewood's home but that no construction force is available to do so; and
- WHEREAS, it has been suggested that the JTPA Program be paid the balance of the construction funds in order to complete Mr. Gatewood's home; and
- Councilmember Dehose has agreed to contact JTPA and WHEREAS, solicit their support in completing the construction of Mr. Gatewood's home and has agreed to coordinate her efforts with Beverly Stago, the HIP Housing Coordinator.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that Councilmember Dehose and HIP Co-Coordinator, Beverly Stago, are hereby directed to make arrangements for the completion of Mr. Gatewood's home by enlisting the assistance of the JTPA Program in completing the construction and furthermore are authorized and directed to transfer funds from the HIP Program to the JTPA Program in consideration of JTPA's completing the construction work.

The foregoing resolution was on December 2, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
