## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, A top priority of the Johnson-Hawkins Administration is to achieve true self-determination for the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the basic foundation supporting self-determination is the development of a nucleus of educated and qualified tribal members capable of assuming positions of leadership and management throughout the tribal organization and capable of training others; and
- WHEREAS, education is a critical requirement for developing and improving the knowledged and skill level of potential tribal leaders and managers; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council has agreed that the College Intern Program successfully provides a source of training and funding for our young people who are currently attending college.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby approves the allocation of \$17,000 to fund the College Intern Program for the FY 87 Christmas Holiday Period (December 28, 1987 through January 15, 1988).

The foregoing resolution was on December 24, 1987, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a), (b),  $\epsilon$  (b) of the Amended Constitution and Bylavs of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
