RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, The Labor Relations Office of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is charged with the responsibility of assuring that Contractors doing work on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are in compliance with the applicable laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, the contract compliance enforcement activities and decisions implemented by the Labor Relations Office results in complaints and grievances by the contractors; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires that a hearing process be undertaken whereby such complaints and grievances may be heard; and
- WHEREAS, the Director of the Labor Relations Office has recommended that a hearing panel be established and that William Riley, Althea Gloshay and Nelson Ethelbah are persons qualified and experienced in these matters who can serve on such a hearing panel.
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe establishes a hearing panel for the Labor Relations Office.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that William Riley, Althea Gloshay, and Nelson Ethelbah are to serve as the members of the hearing panel until other and different appointments are made.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the hearing panel is to work with the Director of Labor Relations Office to establish a permanent process and procedures by which the complaints and grievances of Contractors may be resolved administratively.

The foregoing resolution was on April 13, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of ELEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
