## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- it has come to the attention of the White Mountain WHEREAS, Apache Tribe that scrap metal, lumber and other refuse and materials left at the old McNary Mill is being confiscated and hauled away by unauthorized persons; and
- the unauthorized removal is not in the best interests WHEREAS, of the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby directs that no further removal of any material from the old McNary Mill may occur without appropriate prior approval and that all such removal must cease and desist immediately; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby delegates to the Small Business Office Director and the Safety Department Director the authority to grant permission for removal of any and all materials from the McNary Mill and gives said officials the authority necessary to carry out this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on August 17, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
