RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that disposal of solid waste in all communities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation is becoming a serious health issue; and
- WHEREAS, neither the White Mountain Apache Tribe nor the Indian Health Service has the heavy equipment needed for solid waste disposal; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has previously requested Indian Health Service personnel in the Environmental Health Department to work with the Ad Hoc Committee to resolve said solid waste disposal problem.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby directs that a letter be sent to the Indian Health Service Unit Director, Ms. Carla Alchesay-Nachu requesting that the Indian Health Service through their Enviornmental Health Department address and resolve the problem of solid waste disposal on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs provide heavy equipment for use in a solid waste disposal program.

The foregoing resolution was on August 17, 1988, duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
