## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council on August 3, 1988 passed a resolution to have a high speed road constructed to Arizona's Department of Transportation specifications and the road is to interconnect Highway 60 from Forestdale to Highway 73 at Lester Oliver's in or near within the Route 48 road alignment; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe recognizes that 8.4 miles of Route 48 has not been constructed from Forestdale to Amos Ranch and 7.6 miles from Amos Ranch to Lester Oliver's has been constructed; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribe grants a gratuitous right-of-way 200 feet in width and 8.4 miles in length from Forestdale to Amos Ranch and 200 feet in width and 7.6 miles in length from Amos Ranch to Highway 73.
- WHEREAS, the Tribe recognizes that this resolution supersedes Resolution No.  $\underline{75-131}$ .
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council wishes that the said road, being known as Route 48, be granted a gratuitous right-of-way for the purpose of performing as needed; surveys, environmental studies, archaeological and soils investigations, materials prospecting and other activities required to collect data for plans to design and construct the said proposed road.

The foregoing resolution was on January 11, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(f)(g) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
