RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, two district Council Members have brought to the attention of the Tribal Council the need for cattle guards at certain locations on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, these needs are associated with roads on the BIA road system at Black River and Cibecue;

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby requests that the BIA look into the matter of the need for cattle guards at the two locations mentioned; and further, that the BIA coordinate with Ronnie Lupe of District I and Lafe Altaha of District II.

The foregoing resolution was on February 13, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
