## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, having been duly advised by Justice Commissioner Vincent Craig, that the honorable Associate Tribal Judge George Garland, now retired, has rendered twenty (20) years of dedicated service to the Tribal Judiciary; and
- WHEREAS, the Governing Body, in its duty to the White Mountain Apache people, is striving to preserve the sacred traditions and customs of the Tribe, by providing equitable Law and Order Services to every person subject to its laws, respectfully and honorably recognizes the faithful service and dedication rendered by the Honorable George Garland; and
- WHEREAS, the Governing Body, wishes to recognize the diligent dedication and sacrifice of those who have been called, to embrace and nurture the laws of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, from its infancy to maturity, for the sake of Law and Order and the posterity of the Tribe; and
- WHEREAS, such individual dedication to White Mountain Apache Jurisprudence should not go unnoticed, but should be properly recognized and rewarded.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Honorable George Garland, Retired White Mountain Apache Tribal Judge, is hereby honored and recognized by this governing body on its own behalf and on behalf of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its people for his diligent and dedicated service to the people rendered as an Associated Judge for the White Mountain Apache Tribe; and further on behalf of Reno Johnson, Sr., Tribal Chairman, and the Tribal Council, Judge Garland deserves our sincere appreciation for his dedicated example of judicious application of the White Mountain Apache Law and Order Code.

The foregoing resolution was on June 2, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of NINE for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
