RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Game and Fish Department is responsible for regulating tribal hunting on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, after reviewing the previous years' hunting regulations and analyzing collected biological data, the Department has developed recommendation to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for the 1989 tribal tribal hunting season; and
- WHEREAS, the Department is proposing a hunting fee system for tribal members and utilizing monies generated from tribal member hunting fees to establish a "Conservation Fund" to develop subprograms identified in their proposal; and
- WHEREAS, the Department is directed to develop and incorporate special provisions within the regulations to address elderly and handicapped hunting; and
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has reviewed and considered the proposed 1989 tribal member hunting regulations and hereby approves the regulations as recommended, and as modified; and further, supports and approves the creation of a "Conservation Fund" to establish the various conserva- tion related programs.

The foregoing resolution was on June 8, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of SIX for and TWO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
