WHEREAS, at the general meeting held on April 4, 1989 to discuss ways to address the problem, it was suggested that a committee be designated to recommend methods of reducing or controlling the populations of said animals.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the following individuals, representing the following organizations to serve on the said committee.

Livestock Associations - Davis Susan Game and Fish - Louis Zospah General Public - Lafe Altaha, Chairman Bureau of Indian Affairs - Frank Jones Indian Health Service - Gina Locklear

## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the BIA Roads Department and the Arizona State Highway Department need to remove unwanted trees, brush, and weeds within the road right-of-ways within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the BIA Roads Department and the Arizona State Highway Department request permission to spray the smaller trees, brush, and weeds with EPA approved herbicide; and
- WHEREAS, the BIA Roads Department and the Arizona State Highway Department request permission to treat stumps with EPA approved herbicides after the larger trees are removed out from the roadsides.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby grants permission to the BIA Roads Department and the Arizona State Highway Department to use only EPA approved herbicides for selective eradication of trees, brush and weeds along and within road right-of-ways within the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. However, the use of any type of soil sterilant is not allowed within road right-of-ways.
