- Ms. Lula Ivins a Land Board member advised the Tribal WHEREAS, Council that said request was indeed approved; and
- WHEREAS, said homesite in Canyon Day is that homesite indicated as part of the Robert Dayaye Plan for Canyon Day.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that a homesite for Canyon and Alice Quintero is hereby approved and land in Canyon Day is assigned to Said assignment to be that homesite identified in the Robert Dayaye Plan for the Quinteros.

The foregoing resolution was on $\underline{\text{July 12, 1989,}}$ duly adopted by a vote of $\underline{\text{SEVEN}}$ for and $\underline{\text{ZERO}}$ against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
