RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Lee and Noreen Katy (Ethelbah) Aday have requested that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe give them a tribal house in Whiteriver which house was built many years ago by the traders (Kirkpatricks) at Cedar Creek who donated the house to the White Mountain Apache Tribe when they closed their business and left the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Aday family has been occupying the house for nine years; and
- WHEREAS, the house is deteriorating and is badly in need of maintenance and repair and the Aday's are willing to maintain and repair the house if it is given to them.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the tribal house identified as the former Kirkpatrick house in Whiteriver is hereby given as a gift to Lee and Noreen Katy (Ethelbah) Aday; and
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Land Board is directed to take appropriate action to give the Adays' a homesite for the land on which the house is situated.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
