## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council of WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe that serious health hazards involving sewage leaks are occurring on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation at three locations identified by the Safety Director, which locations are:
  - The area in which KNNB, the Education Building, 1. the Skill Center and the adjacent housing are located;
  - An area in the Canyon Day Housing Project;
  - Evangeline Gordon in Canyon Day; and 3.
- the Maintenance Department and Utility Department has WHEREAS, not undertaken the needed and absolutely necessary repairs because of the uncertainty over which entity will be responsible for payment of costs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it recognizes the health hazards associated with the sewage leaks and on behalf of the Utility and Maintenance Department waives any and all costs and fees for the necessary repairs and directs that such repairs be immediately undertaken by the Maintenance and Utility Departments.
- FURTHER BE IT RESOLVED that the Safety Officer for the White Mountain Apache Tribe is instructed to oversee project.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of EIGHT for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
