## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is gravely concerned about the health hazards caused by sewer leakages in certain communities on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council understands that some of the problem lies in the fact that the sewer systems and extensive renovation; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is advised that funding may be available to the Tribe from the Department of Housing and Urban Development through the Community Development Block Grant Program for said renovations.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Planning Office is hereby directed to make application for funding for the renovation of the sewer systems on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation through the Community Development Block Grant Program and to do all things necessary and proper to secure said funding; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLED that Tribal Maintenance and Tribal Utility be reimbursed for any costs they incur in taking immediate action to remedy the problems pending receipt of other funds; and
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the BIA Superintendent be advised for the seriousness of the problem and that his assistance be sought through additional funding and other means.

The foregoing resolution was on August 3, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
