RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe is the governing body and has authority to oversee the operation of the tribe; and
- WHEREAS, there is a need on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for family support service to parents and guardians who have children with developmentally disabled children and they need time away from home from time to time. This program will provide such services based on parental desires. Such program has been effective in other areas of Arizona; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe working with the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Office of Indian Education supports the Handicapped Program implemented by the Bureau of Indian Affairs and authorizes the establishment of the Family Support Services, Respite/Sitter Services offered by the Arizona Department of Economic Security as a component of the various services provided to handicapped children on the reservation.
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs Office of Indian Education is hereby authorized to arrange for the delivery of Family Support Services, Respite/Sitter Services.

The foregoing resolution was on August 3, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of <u>EIGHT</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
