RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE

- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service has been charged with the responsibility to provide comprehensive health care to Native American people; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service is unable to provide all the needed services for the White Mountain Apache Tribe and its members and must rely upon the use of contracted private sources outside of the Indian Health Service to meet unusual needs; and
- WHEREAS, the Indian Health Service is funded for payment of these services through the Contract Health Services Budget; and
- WHEREAS, due to financial insufficiencies within this line item funding every year many of the needs of the White Mountain Apache Tribal members are unmet with many individuals unable to receive curative therapy or rehabilitation for painful or disabling conditions.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe requests significant additional funding from Congress in the Contract Health Services Budget, for the Whiteriver Service Unit.

The foregoing resolution was on August 3, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of TEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
