RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Horseshoe Lake has become choked with aquatic vegetation making the lake almost unfishable; and
- WHEREAS, the Game & Fish Department has tried both chemical and mechanical treatments to alleviate the weed problem without success; and
- WHEREAS, if the current trend continues, the lake will probably be unfishable within five years; and
- WHEREAS, draining the lake, allowing the ground to dry, and then using heavy equipment to scrape and reshape the bottom should relieve the problem for at least ten years;
- THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Game and Fish Department of the White Mountain Apache Tribe shall immediately proceed with the renovation of Horseshoe Lake, including the draining and closing of the lake until the project is completed.

The foregoing resolution was on December 14, 1989, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1(a),(f),(i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
