RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe will be submitting an application for 1990's New Housing allocation to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development; and
- WHEREAS, the applicants will be requested to obtain two lot assignments from the Land Board; and
- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Tribe is concerned with the requirement that applicants select two sites but both sites have not been surveyed in some instances causing difficulties for the applicants and the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority; and
- WHEREAS, in the Rick Daniels situation though Mr. Daniels selected a second site, when the first site proved unacceptable, the Department of Housing and Urban Development refused to survey the second site leaving Mr. Daniels with little alternative but to defer his housing to a later date.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that the Department of Housing and Urban Development and the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority
 conduct site survey on both sites picked by the 1990
 applicants to eliminate the problems which arose in the
 Rick Daniels situation.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>January 10, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
