

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the non-member homesite leases at Hon Dah continue to expire according to their terms; and

WHEREAS, Mr. John Warren, a non-member, has for many years enjoyed a homesite at Hon Dah and recently there has arisen some question concerning the removal of his cabin at the expiration of his lease which expiration occurred on October 31, 1989; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Warren's lease provided that upon the expiration of the lease he would have a maximum period of ninety (90) days within which to remove his cabin and effective January 31, 1990, that ninety day period has expired; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Warren through the Washington, D.C. Office of the Assistant Secretary, the Area Office and the local agency of the Bureau of Indian Affairs has made request to the Tribal Council that he be given additional time within which to remove his cabin from the Hon Dah homesite area; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that Mr. Warren, due to extenuating circumstances was led to believe by the Bureau of Indian Affairs that the Tribal Council would make some concession in this regard and this reliance by Mr. Warren on the representations of the Bureau has created the circumstances where his cabin under the strict terms of the lease would now become tribal property due to Mr. Warren's failure to remove the cabin within the 90-day removal period, however, the Tribal Council wishes to accommodate Mr. Warren due to the extenuating circumstances.


THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby grants to Mr. John Warren a period of thirty (30) calendar days from today's date within which to remove his cabin from the Hon Dah area and off the Fort Apache Indian Reservation. Said removal to be accomplished without cutting any trees or otherwise damaging the natural environment.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that there will be no further extensions of time to remove the cabin beyond the thirty (30) day period established by this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on January 31, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and two against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
