

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Tribal Constitution of the White Mountain Apache Tribe calls for regular elections to be held for the election of council members; and

WHEREAS, the Office of Tribal Chairman, Vice Chairman and five council seats will be up for general election in April of 1990 and the tribal election laws call for a primary election to be held in order to determine the candidates whose names will appear on the general election in April 1990; and

WHEREAS, the primary election was held by the tribe on Wednesday, February 7, 1990, wherein candidates submitted their names to a vote of the people in order to determine which candidates will appear on the general election ballot in April, 1990 for the following offices:

1. Tribal Chairman
2. Vice Chairman
3. District I Council Representative
4. District II Council Representative
5. District III Council Representative
6. District IV Council Representative (2 positions);

and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Commission has certified to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the primary election is complete and has been carried out in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 3 of the Government Code of the White Mountain Apache Tribe and has a certified that of a total reservation wide vote of 3,386 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals who submitted their names for the Office of Tribal Chairman:

and the Election Commission has certified that the two candidates receiving the first highest and second highest number of votes have qualified to have their names appear on the General Election Ballot in April 1990 and those individuals are Reno Johnson, Sr. and Ronnie Lupe and a copy of the Election Commission certification is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Commission has certified to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that of a total reservation wide vote of 3,335 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals who submitted their names for the Office of Vice Chairman:

and the Election Commission has certified that the two candidates receiving the first highest and second highest number of votes have qualified to have their names appear on the General Election Ballot in April 1990 and those individuals are Lafe Altaha and Herbert Tate and a copy of the Election Commission certification is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Commission has certified that of a total District III vote of 773 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals who submitted their names for the Office of Council Representative for District III:

and the Election Commission has certified that the two candidates receiving the first highest and second highest number of votes have qualified to have their names appear on the General Election Ballot in April and those individuals are Alvin Declay and Randall Massey, Jr. and a copy of the Election Commission certification is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Election Commission has certified to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that of a total District IV vote of 2,643 votes, the following number of votes were received by the following individuals who submitted their names for the Office of Council Representative for District IV:

and the Election Commission has certified that the three candidates receiving the first, second, and third highest number of votes have qualified to have their names appear on the General Election Ballot in April 1990 and those individuals are Johnny Frank Endfield, Raymond Endfield, Jr., and Carol Williams and a copy of the Election Commission certification is attached hereto and incorporated herein; and

WHEREAS, the Election Commission further informs the Tribal Council that it was not necessary to have a primary election in Districts I and II for the Tribal Council representative due to the fact that only two candidates from each of the districts submitted nominating petitions for the election and therefore after having qualified pursuant to the nominating petition procedure are eligible to have their names appear on the ballot of the General Election in April 1990; and

WHEREAS, the Election Commission informs the Tribal Council that the following individuals have qualified by submitting the required nominating petitions to the Tribal Council Secretary and are eligible as candidates in the 1990 General Election

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council concurs with the certification presented by the Tribal Election Commission and is of the opinion that the Commission certification should be affirmed and accepted by the Tribal Council.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the certification of election results submitted by the Tribal Election Commission for the Office of Tribal Chairman, Tribal Vice Chairman and Council Representatives from District I, II, III, and IV

are hereby accepted and the attached certification of election results are incorporated into this resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the candidates whose names will appear on the General Election Ballot for the April 1990 General Election of the White Mountain Apache Tribe are as follows:
