

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the Executive Director of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority has advised the Tribal Council that applications are being prepared for submission to the Regional Office of the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development, Office of Indian Programs (HUD), for 1990 funding to construct Mutual Help and Rental housing units on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for the benefit of tribal members; and

WHEREAS, applications to HUD require an affirmative statement by the Tribal Council as governing body of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to the effect that there is land available for lease to the Housing Authority or for assignment to individual tribal members whereon may be constructed Mutual Help and Rental housing units either in a subdivision or on scattered sites within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council is of the opinion that adequate housing is among the most pressing need of the White Mountain Apache people and the Tribal Council supports every effort of the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority to bring about the construction of additional Mutual Help and Rental housing units on the reservation and to make land available for the construction of said homes once definite locations are determined.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby affirms to the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development and to the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority that adequate land exists and is available within the boundaries of the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for lease to the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority or assignment to individual tribal members whereon may be constructed Mutual-Help or rental dwelling units either in subdivision or in scattered sites within the various reservation communities.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that upon final determination by the White Mountain Apache Housing Authority concerning the location of the proposed homes, the Tribal Council will take the necessary action to make the land available and accessible to the Housing Authority either by lease to the Housing Authority or by assignment to individual



tribal members depending upon whether the construction is for a subdivision or scattered site housing.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe shall take all necessary measures to carry out the intent and purposes of this resolution.

The foregoing resolution was on February 21, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (c) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
