

RESOLUTION OF THE
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, the action taken by the Tribal Council in Resolution No. 01-90-08 requires an amendment to Ordinance No. 123, enacted on July 15, 1982 which Ordinance established minimum wages to be paid on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe desires that a minimum wage in the construction industry be established as set forth in Resolution No. 01-90-08.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Section 2.2 of the White Mountain Apache Labor Code (derived from Ordinance 123) is hereby amended by adding at the end of Section 2.2 D. entitled "Minimum Wage" the following language;

"and minimum wage shall also mean the minimum wage established from time to time by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe on and for construction projects."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that Section 2.3 of the White Mountain Apache Labor Code (derived from Ordinance 123) is additionally amended by adding at the end of "A" thereof, the following new section "B".

"B" The Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe hereby establishes a minimum wage rate on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation for construction projects which wage scale is as follows:



Unlisted classifications needed for work not included within the scope of the list may be added from time to time. All contractors and sub-contractors doing construction work on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation are required to pay said rates to their workers on a weekly basis."

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Secretary of the White Mountain Apache Tribal Council is hereby directed to post the proposed changes in Ordinance 123 reflected in this resolution for ten days as required.

The foregoing resolution was on February 22, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of SEVEN for and ZERO against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat. 984).
