RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the Bureau of Indian Affairs is planning to move its' Radio Dispatcher Operation out of Whiteriver to Hondah or McNary; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe considers such a move undesirable because of the inconvenience to tribal members and the potential for the Bureau of Indian Affairs to use this move in the future as an excuse to eliminate employment of tribal members; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council believes that the Bureau of Indian Affairs very existence is for the benefit and welfare of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, and said potential move is not in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it opposes the planned move by Bureau of Indian Affair's Forestry of the Radio Dispatch Station from Whiteriver to McNary or Hondah.

The foregoing resolution was on February 22, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of seven for and zero against by the Tribal Counci of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
