RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has reviewed the Fort Apache Agency, Bureau of Indian Affairs FY-92 Proposed Budget; and
- WHEREAS, the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe feels that even at the recommended 100% funding level, the 63% Contracts of the White Mountain Apache Tribe will be adversely affected, specifically the Scholarship, Adult Education, Adult Vocational Training and Tribal Courts programs; and
- WHEREAS, each 638 Program Director has presented to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe budgets based on actual need; and
- WHEREAS, a needs based budget would require additional funds in the amount of \$564,000 (five hundred sixty-four thousand dollars); and
- WHEREAS, after reviewing other programs for possible decreases to meet the need of the Scholarship, Adult Education, Adult Vocational Training and Tribal Court budgets the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe were only able to identify a possibility of an additional \$174,000 (one hundred seventy-four thousand dollars);
- THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe instructs the Superintendent of the Fort Apache Agency to identify an additional \$390,000 (three hundred ninety thousand dollars) needed to adequately operate the programs contracted pursuant to P.L. 93-638.

The foregoing resolution was on March 22, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of six for zero against one abstain by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (c) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe, June 27, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
