

RESOLUTION OF THE  
WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE  
FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, Gladys Bencomo has come before the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe to report that the McNary Community has selected McNary Community Committee Officers and said committee has selected Ms. Bencomo to speak to the Tribal Council on their behalf; and
- WHEREAS, Gladys Bencomo of the McNary Community Committee has come before the Tribal Council to request the support of the Tribal Council for a clean up day at McNary; and
- WHEREAS, the clean up will include the use of donated equipment to demolish old buildings including the old gas station; and
- WHEREAS, the McNary Community wishes to express its request to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the multi purpose office used by Safety Director in McNary remain in service for the community's multi purpose uses; and
- WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that the McNary community be supported in its efforts to clean up the McNary area.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that April 28, 1990 is hereby declared Clean-Up day at McNary.


The foregoing resolution was on April 11, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of eight for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (a) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
