RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

WHEREAS, tribal member Layne Endfield, requests Tribal Council approval to sell twenty (20) cords of juniper off the reservation; and

WHEREAS, Layne Endfield has satisfactorily explained to the Tribal Council that the juniper was previously cut and stored in his yard but due to problems beyond his control he was unable to sell it within the time required by a previous resolution which imposed a freeze upon any sale of juniper off the reservation for commercial purposes and for other than home use by tribal members.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby approves and authorized Layne Endfield to sell twenty (20) cords of juniper now in storage at his property to persons off the reservation.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 6, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>SEVEN</u> for and <u>ZERO</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (h) (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
