RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the previous Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe passed Resolution No. 03-90-61 on March 29, 1990 which addressed the problem of drought on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation and the plight of the Cattle Associations on the reservation which for the last three years have been adversely impacted due to the drought and its serious effect on the ability of cattle to find sufficient feed and water on the open ranges of the reservation; and
- WHEREAS, the newly elected Tribal Council which took office on May 2, 1990 has reviewed Resolution No. 03-90-61 and hereby reaffirms the commitment of the Tribal Council to assist the Cattle Associations in filing applications with the Bureau of Indian Afffairs and U.S. Department of Agriculture so that they can participate in available Emergency Cattle Feeding Programs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby reaffirms the commitment of the Tribal Council embodied in Resolution No. 03-90-61 in which the Tribal Council directed the Tribal Planners Office to take every possible action to assist the Cattle Associations in filing applications with the Bureau of Indian Affairs and U.S. Department of Agriculture for participation in available Emergency Cattle Feeding Programs.

The foregoing resolution was on <u>June 20, 1990</u>, duly adopted by a vote of <u>ten</u> for and <u>zero</u> against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (f) (i) (s) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
