## RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, it is necessary that a Forest Management Plan be prepared every 10 ten years for the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- an inventory is needed every 10 years for computation WHEREAS, of tree growth, annual allowable cut and other considerations in the Forest Management Plan; and
- the previous measurement of continuous Forest Inventory WHEREAS, plots was made in 1984 and the next measurement needs to be performed in 1994; and
- there are tribal forestry graduates who are capable of WHEREAS, performing the necessary measurements in 1994.
- BE IT RESOLVED, that the Bureau of Indian Affairs plan and budget for performance of a measurement of the Continuous Forest Inventory plots in 1994 by means of a P.L.-93-638 contract by the White Mountain Apache Tribe.
