RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, White Mountain Apache Males are at high risk to health problems such as alcohol, homicide, suicide, sexually transmitted diseases, mental health problems and other social problems; and
- WHEREAS, with an overall goal to providing improved health services and to address this health problem, the White Mountain Apache Health Education Department desires to submit a grant proposal for a comprehensive "Community Coalition Project to support Health and Human Service Needs for Minority Males"; and
- WHEREAS, these efforts are designed to achieve a measurable improvement in the health of Native American males and to inspire individuals to take, positive steps towards achieving wellness; and
- WHEREAS, if grants are awarded they would be funded in FY 1991 to fund the development and support for community projects; and
- WHEREAS, the Whiteriver Service Unit has recently expressed its interest in and support for said proposal.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache
 Tribe that it hereby authorizes and directs the Tribal
 Health Education Department to submit for a grant
 proposal for the "Health and Human Service needs of the
 Minority Males".

The foregoing resolution was on July 11, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (b) (i) (j) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
