RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, tribal member Levi Dehose from Cibecue Community has come before the Tribal Council and requested assistance to repair his water line which was installed by the Utility Authority on the surface of his farmland and which suffered breakage as a result of plowing his field; and
- WHEREAS, he further requests assistance of the Tribal Council to have the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Roads Department repair his road; and
- WHEREAS, after due discussion in respect to his requests, the Tribal Council concurs.
- BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe that it hereby directs the Tribal Utility Authority to repair Levi Dehose's waterline as soon as possible.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that it requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Roads Department to repair Mr. Dehose's road.
- BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED by the Tribal Council that its requests the Bureau of Indian Affairs, Roads Department to report to the Office of the Tribal Chairman upon completion of the work requested herein.

The foregoing resolution was on August 1, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of nine for and zero against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984)
