RESOLUTION OF THE WHITE MOUNTAIN APACHE TRIBE OF THE FORT APACHE INDIAN RESERVATION

- WHEREAS, the White Mountain Apache Game and Fish Department is responsible for developing and implementing tribal member hunting regulations on the Fort Apache Indian Reservation; and
- WHEREAS, after reviewing the previous years hunting regulations and analyzing hunting and game population data, the Department has developed and presented recommendations to the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe for the 1990-91 tribal member hunting season; and
- WHEREAS, the Department is once again proposing a tribal member fee system in order to continue maintaining the WILDLIFE CONSERVATION FUND to operate the various conservation related programs developed; and
- WHEREAS, due to financial hardship, employee layoffs, and high unemployment, the Tribal Council concludes that the proposed tribal member fee system should be waived for one year and that accordingly, the enterprise manager shall not be held accountable for a reduction of revenue due to said waiver.
- BE IT RESOLVED that the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe has reviewed and considered the proposed 1990-91 Tribal Member Hunting Regulations and hereby approves the regulations as presented, provided that the tribal member fee system shall be waived for a period of one year due to the financial condition prevailing on the reservation and the high unemployment rate.

The foregoing resolution was on August 2, 1990, duly adopted by a vote of six for and five against by the Tribal Council of the White Mountain Apache Tribe, pursuant to authority vested in it by Article V, Section 1 (i) of the Amended Constitution and Bylaws of the Tribe, ratified by the Tribe June 27, 1958, and approved by the Secretary of the Interior on May 29, 1958, pursuant to Section 16 of the Act of June 18, 1934 (48 Stat.984).
